Financing	Renovation of the branch was funded by a \$105.9 million bond measure passed by voters in November 2000 that calls for 19 branches to be renovated, four leased facilities to be replaced with City-owned buildings and one brand-new branch to be constructed in Mission Bay. The Branch Library Improvement Program (BLIP) is the largest capital improvement campaign in the history of the San Francisco Public Library. Friends of the San Francisco Public Library raised \$500,000 in private funds to pay for furniture, fixtures and equipment at the branch not covered by the bond.
