bond measure passed by voters in November 2000 and \$500,000 in private funds raised by the Friends of the San Francisco Public Library for

furniture, fixtures and equipment.

**Program** The Branch Library Improvement Program (BLIP) is the largest capital

improvement campaign in the history of the San Francisco Public Library. BLIP calls for 16 branches to be renovated, four leased facilities to be replaced with City-owned buildings, three branches to be replaced with new buildings, and one brand-new branch in Mission Bay. Ortega is the

21<sup>st</sup> completed project.

- Electronic bulletin board/monitor to display events, view living roof from inside the branch, present library programs & much more

## Environmentally sound

- Designed to meet LEED Silver standards or greater
- A living, breathing roof that retains rain water, keeps building cool and warm and provides a natural habitat for bees, butterflies & birds
- Efficient, comfortable and flexible heating system
- Extensive natural lighting throughout building
- Drought-tolerant and native species landscaping
- Bioswales to capture water from the roof to retain and use water on site instead of adding to the sewer system
- Natural linoleum flooring and high performance lighting fixtures
- Paints, adhesives, and sealants that contain only low levels of volatile organic compounds
- Over 79% of the project's construction waste was diverted from landfill
- Natural ventilation via operable windows
- New bicycle racks
- Transit friendly location (MUNI 16X, 29, 48, 71, & 71L)
